I. SCHOOL INFORMATION

A. School Profile

Christian Alliance Cheng Wing Gee College was established in 1984, the third school affiliated with the Kowloon Tong Church of the Chinese Christian and Missionary Alliance. Our school is a full-time aided co-educational secondary grammar school.

B. Mission Statement

Based on Christian ethos, the unified team of devoted, collaborative staff members of the school advocates whole-person and balanced education in the areas of spirituality, ethics, intellect, physique, social skills and aesthetics. It is hoped that the students can develop self-confidence, self-discipline and self-learning spirit in a supportive and encouraging environment. At the same time, we aim to help our students learn the redemption gospel, understand life-guiding principles, learn to be well-mannered, think discreetly and show discernment, act swiftly and be healthy, know how to appreciate others and artistry, love their families and community, contribute to the country, and ultimately glorify God and benefit mankind.

D. Campus Facilities

The school improvement programme of the new block completed in 2004 provides extra space to improve the learning environment and students' multi-intelligence development. There are 30 standard classrooms and special rooms equipped with IT teaching and learning facilities. The library, provided with online databases, enables students to learn and access information outside classrooms accourding to their needs and interests.



I. Teaching Staff's Qualifications & Professional Development

Our teaching staff members, including holders of one PhD, 29 master and 57 bachelor degrees, are well-qualified and experienced. Moreover, all of our English and Putonghua teachers have either been granted exemption from or have fulfilled the Language Proficiency Requirement.

Our teachers were encouraged to acquire subject knowledge and prepare well for their teaching. In the academic year 2019-20, our teachers enrolled various in house and off-campus training courses with a total of 3033 hours (to the nearest 100). Some teachers also enhanced their professional training by pursuing master degrees in their subject areas.

II. ACHIEVEMENTS & REFLECTION ON MAJOR CONCERNS

OPERATIONAL STRATEGIES

Major Concern I: To nurture students with the essence of being self-directed learners

Achievements:

- 1.1. About 90% (90.19%) of teachers agreed that students had built up intrinsic learning motivation in their subjects and the most impressive figure was the percentage of students' willingness to accomplish the assigned tasks in their subjects, which was 96.08%.
- 1.2 The percentage of students' understanding of the lesson contents was 98.04 and teachers also appreciated the percentage of their providing opportunities for students to have exchange of ideas among themselves during the lessons, which was 98.04.
- 1.3 Regarding whether intrinsic motivation of students was built up through subject strategies, it was found that 100% of teachers opined that their subjects implemented strategies to enhance students' mastery of learning though the degree of initiatives as taken by students varied among teachers of different subjects.
- 1.4 Both teachers and students agreed that students' capabilities had been expanded in their teaching and learning especially in the use of e-Learning skills and tools (above 80% for both parties). During the period of school suspension, electronic media such us digital resources and communication tools were widely used during lessons. Different levels of interactions could be found among students in various lessons, and they were engaged in the interactive activities during the online lessons.

Reflection:

- 1.1 Students' goal-setting was an area concerned by teachers as it was found that some students did not know how to set their goals. Hence, assistance should be given to the needy students so as to help them become more self-directed learners.
- How to encourage students to read should be an issue which needs to be further addressed in the coming year as teachers, students and parents agree that there is much room for improvement in reading.
- 1.3 Some staff professional development programmes and peer observation among teachers could not be arranged as scheduled because many of them were arranged in the second term while there was school suspension starting from 3rd February 2020 and there was no real-time learning and teaching until 27th May 2020. Hence, these two will be re-arranged in the coming school year.

Major Concern II: To empower students to shoulder responsibilities and explore their potential

Achievements:

- 2.1. Both junior-level students and senior-level students who had served as committee members of clubs or societies or student service groups opined that they had enhanced their expression and presentation skills while having on-stage presentation. A very high of percentage of 100% was got from junior-level students. Besides, 96.43% of senior-level student-leaders reflected that their self-confidence was increased while being given opportunities to address the mass and speak on-stage. All levels of students enjoyed shouldering more responsibilities through which they felt good, their skills being sharpened and confidence increased.
- 2.2 Though the school days were cut short in 2019-20 because of having a lengthy period of school suspension in the second term, both senior-level and junior-level students were satisfied with the collaboration among committee members. It was especially true for junior-level student-leaders as 100% of them thought that they could acquire leadership skills while working with their senior counterparts, another 100% of feeling satisfied with the collaboration and also 100% of feeling very happy about the teamwork achieved. Regarding senior-level student leaders, above 90% of them found the collaborative work in their groups satisfying.
- 2.3 95.46% of class teachers opined that students could learn about the importance of teamwork and responsibility via various programmes, mass events and life education lessons, etc.
- Over 90% of students reflected that they could learn about how to build up one's power of leadership from the talk delivered by alumni.

Reflection:

- 2.1 Yet, it was delighted to know that there was good collaboration among student leaders no matter whether they were junior-level or senior-level students. The Peer Mentoring Scheme is a good initiative and a 'mentoring culture' and supporting spirit among students have been promoted, which should be continued in future.
- 2.2. All the excursions could not be held as scheduled because of the pandemic. It is hoped that those activities that have been cancelled can be arranged in future. Yet, it is not easy to make plans of arranging overseas trips as we have difficulties in figuring out when our lives will no longer be adversely affected by COVID-19
- About 80% of ECA or Student Service Group advisors reflected that more meetings could be arranged for student-leaders in their respective committees. Teacher advisers may need more time and space so that student-leaders can have more interactions among themselves and, at the same time get more guidance from teachers for advice and improvements.

Major Concern III: To empower middle management team for school future sustainable development

Achievements:

- 3.1. 92.59% of the middle management staff members reflected that they were empowered as they could be involved in school policy-making.
- 3.2 88.88% of the respondents who filled out the questionnaires said that they found their leadership and management skills had been enhanced, though not many professional development programmes could be arranged as scheduled.
- 3.3 About 90 % of the middle management staff members agreed that the objectives have partially achieved.

Reflection:

- 3.1 It is hoped that there will be arrangements for paying visits to member school of KTAC and other schools during their Open Day or paying a visit after making some special arrangements in 2020-21 as many visits have been cancelled in 2019-20 because of school suspension. Besides, teachers can be given opportunities to have meetings after the visits to discuss what insights got can be implemented in our school after making some adaptations or adjustments.
- Only 66.6% of respondents reflected that some administrative duties had been delegated to them and it shows that some colleagues can assume more administrative duties to stretch their potential. Senior management staff can identify suitable teachers to shoulder more responsibilities to ease the problem of having insufficient manpower resources at the management level.
- 3.3 To strengthen the management team and integrate our Christian faith, the theme of having professional development with the essence of 'Servant Leaders' has been introduced and supported by all the middle management staff members. Hence, guest speaker(s) will be invited to come and colleagues will equip themselves with the enlightenment of servant leadership in 2020-21 and school years in future.

III. OUR LEARNING & TEACHING

A. Reading to Learn

The arrangement of book sharing of senior- level students for junior-level students and the collaboration with the school library in promoting reading helped cultivate an extensive reading atmosphere among students. Both junior-level and senior-level students could benefit from this exercise. Yet, the number of sharing sessions has been greatly

reduced because of the prolonged school suspension in the second term. Reading activities are arranged by subject teachers and committee heads, students are expected to read books and articles of various subject contents so as to widen their scope and read the materials which match with the mass events held in school as well. We also aim to promote 'Reading across the Curriculum' by making use of a variety of texts including non-fiction texts on various themes and topics. There is also School Reading Award like the activity of 'Let Reading Shine' to encourage students to enjoy reading. It is hoped that students can be engaged in reading and also be able to connect their learning experiences, broaden their knowledge base and enhance their language skills. The views collected in the stakeholders' survey showed that students' motivation to read should be noted and more strategies have to be adopted to promote reading among students. To facilitate students to read and make use of the resources like online databases and e-books in the library, students will be required to make use of the above facilities to do their assignments as what we did in the past years but more incentives will be given to students.

B. Project Learning

Cross-curricular projects were implemented at our junior secondary levels, from S.1 to

S.3. They were aimed at integrating and applying knowledge and skills across disciplines.

S.1: MATH + ICT + VA; IS + GEOG + ICT + D&T

S.2: IS + ICT + CHIST + D&T + ENG; HE + VA

S.3: A&T + MATH + HE + BAFS + ICT

C. Information Technology for Interactive Learning and Self-directed Learning

The school is well-equipped with information technology facilities. All classrooms and special rooms are equipped with a computer, projector and visualizer. The Campus TV provides students with opportunities to enhance their creativity, problem-solving ability and communication skills. Its facilities were upgraded in 2015-16 and the years onwards. It is hoped that students' potential can be more fully stretched by participating in the activities organized. E-Class has been adopted for both school administration and interactive learning. Students submit their assignments and get comments from teachers through the e-Class. Discussion and communication are encouraged among students and

teachers by using various online platforms. An e-Learning coordinator is assigned in each subject to explore and implement different e-Learning pedagogies and resources at subject level. In addition, sharing sessions on e-Learning tools or practices have been arranged during general staff meetings by Chairperson of the Information Technology Committee (ITC) to promote staff professional interflow, which helps to enhance teaching and learning among teachers. During the period of school suspension, online learning and teaching became the daily routine. Thanks should go to the efforts made by teachers and colleagues of ITC. Online lessons were conducted and online learning tools like Kahoot!, EdPuzzle and Nearpod were frequently used by teachers.

D. Value Education including Basic Law Education

It is our aim to enable every student 'to become an informed and responsible citizen with a sense of national and global identity, appreciation of positive values and attitudes as well as Chinese culture and respect for pluralism in society.' The values like 'Showing Perseverance', 'Having Respect for Others, Sense of Responsibility, National Identity, Commitment, Integrity and Caring for Others' are expected to be found in the teaching and learning of all Key Learning Areas. A working group has been set up to be concerned about the promotion of Basic Law Education in school. The Convenor, who is the Chairperson of the Chinese History Panel, will work with his members including the Chairperson of the Moral and Civic Education Committee and Vice- Chairperson of the Liberal Studies Panel. It is hoped that students can hence have better understanding of the importance of Basic Law and the principle of 'One Country, Two Systems'.

E. Learning without Boundaries

Other Learning Experiences Day and various excursions had been arranged for students to experience learning outside the classroom; yet, all the programmes could not be organized as scheduled because of the pandemic and school suspension. It is hoped that these activities can be arranged and organized in 2020-21.

IV. SUPPORT FOR STUDENT DEVELOPMENT

Our school bears the mission of nurturing students' whole-person development and personal growth as individuals and members of the community through collaboratively organizing programmes by the School External Affairs Committee, Religious Affairs Committee, Moral and Civic Education Committee, Discipline Committee, Counselling Committee and Extra-curricular Activities Committee with Christian faith as our mission and vision .

A. Pastoral Care

We believe that every student is unique and deserves individual care. Our students are provided with a strong network of support through a dual class teacher system; orientation programmes for S.1 and S.4 students; Big-Brother-and-Big-Sister Scheme; teacher training and workshops on catering for students with special educational needs (SEN). Ever since 2010, we have held two to three weeks of S.1 Orientation Programmes for S.1 students to help them adapt to their new school life by concerted efforts of different committees. In 2019-20, S1 Orientation Weeks were organized for students. It is hoped that students can better prepare themselves for their secondary education. Besides, the great support given by the educational psychologist (20 visits or more a year with collaboration and support given to teachers and parents by the school sponsoring body, funded by the EDB), the two school social workers (by Hong Kong Children and Youth Services, funded by the EDB), a part-time counselling worker and an additional Teaching Assistant (funded by the Learning Support Grant) meets the needs of SEN students and at the same time provides pastoral care for those students who are in need. In a word, our school team members endeavour to realize our potential and develop a deepening sense of care for the needy students and their family.

During the period of school suspension, the programme, 'Happy Fridays', was initiated by school social workers and supported by teachers. There were 330 participants (S1-S5 students) having very good response especially from S1 students. The programme aimed at building up students' sense of ownership to school even though everyone of us had to study at home and work from home in February- May 2020. In addition, 'CWGC Challenge' was launched by the Counselling Committee. There were a total of 660 participations from S1-S5 students. Students who could complete three challenges were

awarded with prizes. 107 students were given awards in this programme. Junior-level students were impressed by the cards got from teachers, whereas senior-level students were impressed by the videos given to them by their families and friends. Out of love and creativity shown by colleagues, students of CWGC experienced a kind of spectacular school life during the period of school suspension in 2019-20.

B. Inclusive Education

Student Support Team for SEN (SST) has been formed since 2008 to cater for students with special educational needs. Each year identification work starts with S.1 registration in which parents are invited on a voluntary basis to submit information regarding their children with special educational needs. Follow-up work is then provided for both newcomers as well as existing SEN students. Through Special Education Management Information System (SEMIS), the school applies for the Learning Support Grant (LSG) for Secondary School. The LSG is used for providing SEN students with appropriate supportive measures and services.

Various supportive strategies and measures have been adopted for SEN students, with a referral system set up for all teaching staff for any suspected cases which will then be referred to the educational psychologist for consultation and /or assessment. Apart from referrals, various school-based supportive measures which include regularly having contacts with students' parents, arranging education programmes or accommodation for each SEN student and teachers attending case conferences. Teachers are also advised to adjust the classroom management techniques, teaching strategies, assignments and adjustments in examinations are given to the students concerned in order to cater for individual needs. Other support such as speech therapy training for individual students, study groups and social skills groups have been provided for students with the corresponding needs as well.

C. Character building via Spiritual, Moral and Civic Education Development

For students' character building, Christian value is instilled in students by offering Life Education lessons, Biblical Knowledge lessons, fellowship programmes, services and religious activities throughout the year as well as Gospel Week held in mid October every year. The theme in 2019-20 was 'God is able'. Christian students and teachers give their

personal witness and share their faith via hymn singing sessions while sharing sessions are also regularly arranged in the morning assemblies. About 80 students attend the fellowship programmes during lunch hour on Tuesdays while about 50-60 students join the worship and group activities on Sundays in KTAC, Tai Wai. Praise the Lord and thanks should go to both parish workers and teachers who make the very good church-school collaboration possible between the church and school.

To foster students' positive moral value and civic awareness, the promotion of environmental protection and use fewer bottles are advocated. Along with the various school-based teaching kits on moral issues, it is hoped that students' sense of civic awareness can be developed. Besides, the inter-class competitions on cleaning, discipline and bulletin board design also helped to foster our students a sense of responsibility, to develop their class spirit and sense of ownership in school.

D. Students' Potential and Leadership Development

In recognizing students' potential, various ambassador award schemes were devised. The 'Student All-round Award Scheme' encouraged students to have wholesome and balanced development. While the 'Student of the Class Scheme' recognized students' perseverance, courtesy and caring spirit apart from their very good performance in learning. The various 'Outstanding Student Awards' aimed at having students' potential recognized and their achievements honoured. The 'Super Class' award for each level was given to the super class which had got outstanding achievements in all respects. Besides, the 'Students' Perseverance Award Scheme' and 'Outstanding Leadership Award Scheme', which was initiated and supported by the Alumni Association in 2017-18, encouraged students to work with perseverance and develop their potential in various respects. For S.6 students, there were the awards of 'Student of the Year' and 'Outstanding Service Award', with the former granted to S.6 student who had both outstanding performance in academic work and services provided to school or the community whereas the latter granted to the student who had reasonably good academic results and provided outstanding services to school or the community. It is our hope that students can stretch their potential and develop their leadership to become leaders of tomorrow with the provision of different awards for students of various levels.

E. Career development

To facilitate individual students to make their own planning, various introductory exercises of the world of work were provided for students as well as activities that could promote self-understanding of their personalities, skills, academic interests and career aspirations. Further exploration of students' interest in work was arranged with the aids of Basic Interest Marker Test (BIM) and Career Interest Inventory Test (CII). Students were guided in interpreting assessment outcomes, supported in formulating their career goals and educational planning as well as developing career management skills that prepare them as life-long learners in society. Because of the prolonged school suspension, many career guidance programmes, career talks, or workplace tours could not be arranged for students. Yet, S6 Parents' Night was held on 16th July 2020 evening in the mode of online programme to prepare students before the release of HKDSE results on 22nd Jul 2020.

No virtue trade fair could be held for the JA Company Programme in 2019-20 because of the pandemic. Yet, we got the award of 'The Best Offering' among various participating local and international schools in Hong Kong. This award justified our tenacious effort and persevering attitude towards work, which were worth being commemorated. It is anticipated that we can pass on the torch of knowledge in launching enterprises to the JA members in subsequent years.

F. Community and global outreaching

Through participating in 'iCare 9' Voluntary Service Campaign and Other Learning Experiences activities arranged by the Moral and Civic Education Committee and the Extra Curricular Activities Committee, students were given opportunities to take part in numerous community services and experiential voluntary activities. Because of the rather short school days in 2019-20, more activities such as visiting the elderly home; serving the homeless, physically impaired and low-income groups will be arranged in the coming school year. To extend our students' global horizons, four trips which were scheduled to be organized by our teachers for students including trips to Okinawa, Taichung, Pingtung and Macau were cancelled because of the prevalent COVID-19 in different parts of the

world. It is hoped that similar excursions which can let students bring home with enriching exposure and insights can be organized in 2020-21.

G. Home-School and Alumni Co-operation

A group of dedicated volunteers and committee members of the Parent-Teacher Association Committee (PTAC) have been assisting school in various school and off-campus activities. They offered assistance in organizing seminars, interest groups and running sharing sessions for parents. They also made donations to the students and their family who have financial needs, and presented awards to the students who did well in their attendance and handing in assignments. Their contributions did bring a closer tie between the school and family, thus building up students' sense of belonging to school. Besides, the Alumni Association gave their support to school in many ways. Some alumni shared with students their study skills or how to develop the power of leadership. The talk delivered by alumni held on 27th November 2019 was well received by both junior-level and senior-level students.


V. STUDENT PERFORMANCE


A. HKDSE Examination Results

2019-20 school year has been a year of progression. Our students have done well in the 2020 HKDSE. The overall passing rate reached 96.3% (100% in English Language, 96.1% Chinese Language, 95.1% Mathematics, 98% Liberal Studies. 91.7% in BAFS, 92% in Biology, 89.7% in chemistry, 94.1% in Chinese History, 100% in DAT, 94.3% in Economics, 97.1% in Geography,100% in ICT, 100% in M2, 92.3% in Physics and 100% in VA). The average subject Level 4 or above rate was 32.4%. There were in total 115 counts of Level 5 or above. The most outstanding student, 6A HO Hang Chi attained Level 5* in 5 subjects. JUPAS statistics told us that 60.6 % of our students obtained a JUPAS offer, (51.51% degree offer and 9.09% sub-degree offer) which was also the best record so far. Students' results in 2020 have shown improvements.



VII. FEEDBACK ON FUTURE PLANNING
